1. Stay involved.

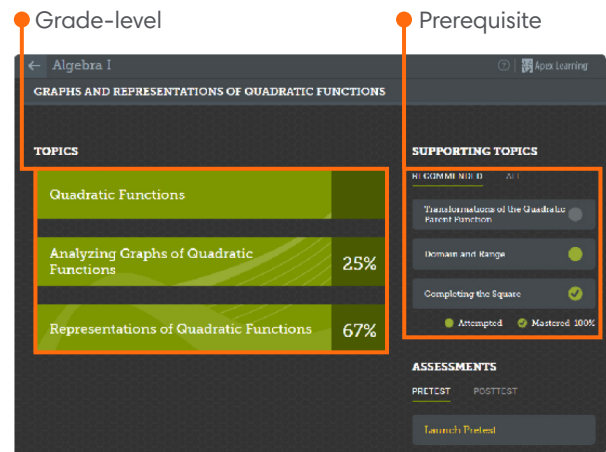
